#### Additional Activity:

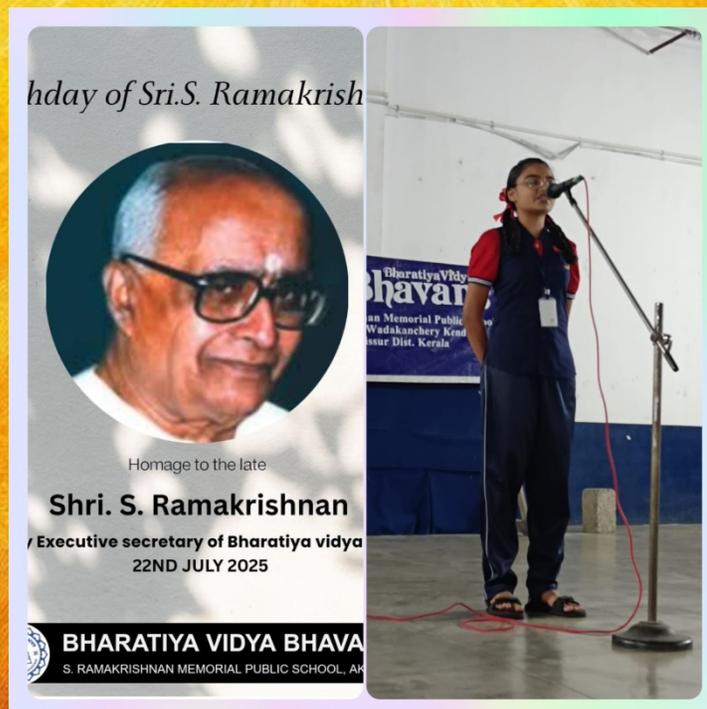

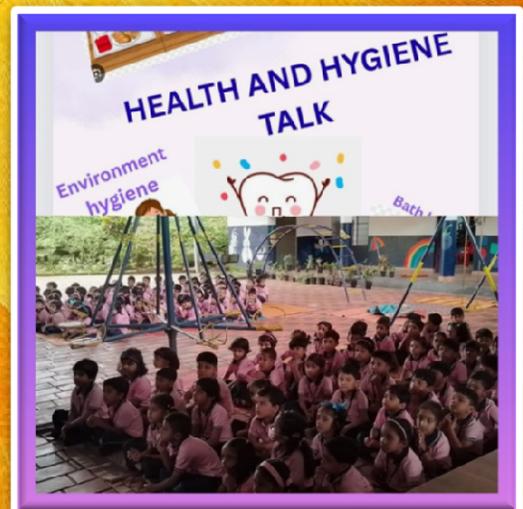
# BALAMANDIR ACTIVITIES

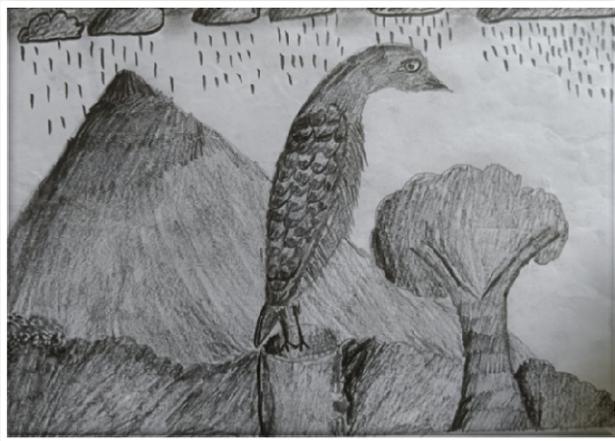
